OVERGROWTH WALK THRU FINDINGS:

On September 16, Mark-Anthony Tynes, DCRA Rep completed the Community Walk Thru. The next process is to ensure that residents are preparing for treatment of Rodent Abatement by “Cleaning-Up” near your home.

DOH Rep has pointed out that overgrowth of grass and weeds would have to be cut and removed prior to the treatment of Rodent Abatements thru out the neighborhood.

Mr. Tynes has submitted 311 Service Requests for homes that require cutting of overgrowth weeds and grass. Upon completion of DCRA’s findings, DOH will prepare for treatment of the Rodent Abatements.

ELECTION OVERVIEW

- Key Dates
 - October 2: Ballots Mailed
 - October 5-8: Mail-in-Ballot Drop Boxes Installed (<https://dcboe.org/Voters/Where-to-Vote/Mail-Ballot-Drop-Sites>)
 - October 13: Voter registration closes (same day registration available at vote centers)
 - October 27: Early Voting Begins (Election Week)
 - November 2: Early Voting Ends
 - November 3: Election Day

- Critical Points
 - All voters registered on or before October 13, 2020 will be mailed a ballot
 - Mail-in-Ballots can be deposited in a drop box, at a vote center or sent back via USPS
 - Voters can vote in-person at ANY vote center during Election Week or on Election Day

- Key Messages
 - If you choose to vote in person, you will likely have to wait in line
 - DCBOE encourages as many voters as possible to use the Mail-In-Ballot Drop Boxes
 - Voters should complete and return their ballot as soon as possible

- Ways to vote
 - Mail-in-Ballot (drop box, vote center, USPS)
 - In person at vote center

- Ways to Register
 - Download Voter Registration Form
 - Email completed form to DCabsentee@dcboe.org
 - Fax completed form to (202) 347-2648
 - Mail or return completed form to the DC Board of Elections at 1015 Half Street, SE, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20003
 - Register in-person at a vote center during early voting or on election day
